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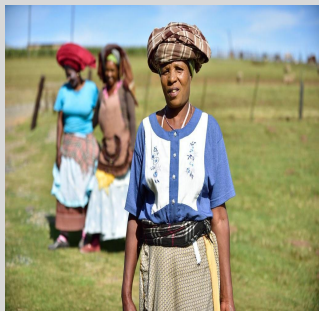

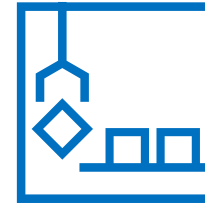

Innovative and Sustainable Financing

- Crowd-in innovative financing mechanisms (corporate shared value, impact investments, Zakat, Takafuls, Waqf, Diaspora funding) that strengthen MCs health systems, reduce health inequities and minimizing financial hardship on the poor.
- Develop investment strategies, national policies and regulatory frameworks to strengthen domestic resourcing, financing and public financial management for health.



Trade in Health

- Advocate for policy and regulation improvements to ease Trade between Member Countries
- Carry out Value chain assessments to identify trade opportunities between Member Countries
- Design of framework to support the private sector with access to capital for the growth



Data for performance and results

- Deploy a health visualizer capable of aggregating and sharing performance and outcome indicators deployed
- Shared learnings across Member States with developed and efficient models for data management.
- Evidence -based advocacy to improve policy and regulation crucial to ease of Trade between Member Countries across the entire health value chain

Resource requirements



In principle, there is a need to reinforce the D-8 HSP Strategic Plan in terms of asset and resource mobilization

FUNDING REQUIREMENT

Endorse a core contributory funding mechanism for the strategic plan budget to support the attainment of D-8 HSP strategic goals

Initial funding required per D-8 HSP Strategic Plan: **\$7.8 Million**

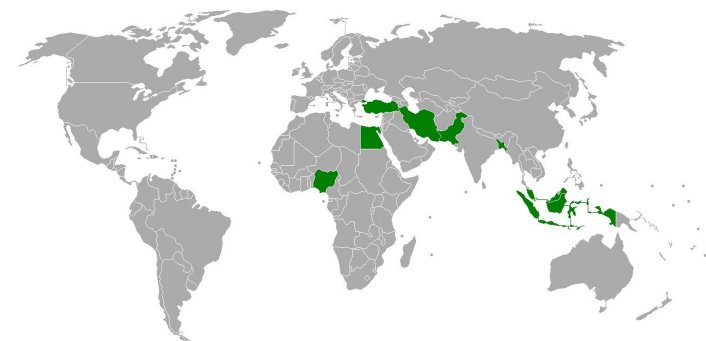
HUMAN CAPITAL REQUIREMENT

Endorse the deployment of technical staff from D-8 Counties to the HSP Programme office in Abuja to support the attainment of D-8 HSP strategic goals and MCs ownership of Programme.

Action required

In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, the D-8 HSP is playing a proactive role as a nerve center and delivery unit in developing the synergies between the pandemic, health system and market needs of individual member countries, and the capabilities and market strengths of aligned member countries.

Keeping in mind recommendations from RT, there is a need to fast track our response and assess the impact of the pandemic through the activation of:



A virtual funding mechanism for COVID19 FF(short-term), health emergencies (medium term) and Vaccine Production (long- term) shaped in the same vein as the current D-8 Project support fund



A common health data repository like the visualizer
